Drawing on field research trips, personal interviews, and Arabic primary sources, the book explores the relationship between the ideologies of the various schools of Salafism and their praxis in relation to Lebanese politics. He said, "They are: associating others in the worship of Allah, sorcery, killing an innocent soul without any legitimate reason, dealing with usury, the battlefield, falsely accusing innocent female believers with fornication, adultery, or moral corruption."
